PETER, writing to strengthen sufering Christians in time of persecution, bade them to cast all their anxiety upon the Lord because he cared for them, and to stand strong in their faith as believing that the God of grace would sustain

John lived to a great age, seemingly serving as pastor of the church at Ephesus. At last he was persecuted by a Roman emperor and banished to the isle of Patmos if the Aegean Sea. There he had a wonderful vision of the New Jerusalem and all the glories of the redeemed. And he recorded what he saw and heard in the Book of Reve-

The telling of the things John saw in his vision were adapted to Christians. They were helped to bear their ills because they were to enter into such transcendant Mories in the great hereafter. So may we be encouraged in the midst d difficulties and trials as we think of the blessed place where the redeemed shall be secure and

One of the elders that John saw fa his vision told him that the great multitude were those who had come out of tribulation and had washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. And we are assured that the "toils of the road will seem nothing when we get to the end of the way."


