



Nicodemus, a Hesitant Follower Lesson for January 27: John 3:

Golden Text: John 3: 3 THE NAME of Nicodemus is familiar to readers of the New Testament and doubtless he is always recalled as one who came to Jesus by night. Did he come by night because he was afraid to

be slow to condemn him as cow-The inquiry of Nicodemus led Jesus to speak to him of the new birth as so necessary that without it no man can enter the kingdom of God. Education, the law, and the resolutions of a man's will cannot make him good, Only through faith

Months after the visit of Nicodemus to Jesus, the Sanhedrin sent officers to arrest Jesus and bring him to them. But the officers returned without Jesus and said, "Never man spake like this man." Hearing this, the rulers vowed that the people who were hearing Jesus were accursed. Then Nicodemus spoke boldly and said, "Doth our law judge any man before it hear him?" Thus he intimated that the rulers were guilty of breaking a law they claimed to uphold. Certainly at that time Nicodemus did not betray any fear.
