

Murdock Nips Elmwood 59-55 In County Thriller

A thirteen point half-time deficit was too much to overcome as an Elmwood rally fell short and Coach Buzz Gakemeier's Murdock quintet walked off with a 59-55 Cass county conference win.

Both teams are strong contenders for the conference championship.

Coach Johnny Johnston's crew fell behind in the first quarter and throughout the first half was unable to keep up with the fast moving Murdock crew. Murdock moved out in front 13-10 at the end of one period and with Ronald Peters dunking nine points, roared into a 37-24 margin at the half.

After an even third quarter which saw Elmwood cut the margin to 11 points, Coach Johnston's crew went to work. Dudley Doebele paced the final quarter rally with a 10 point barrage as Elmwood registered 19 points. In the meantime, Murdock hit consistently from the foul line to stay in front.

Coach Gakemeier's crew actually won the game from the free throw line with a miraculous showing capitalizing on 25 free throw attempts. Murdock hit on 19 for an average of 76 per cent. Meanwhile Elmwood hit on only 9 of 21 for 43 per cent.

Albert Thiel paced the win-

ners from the free throw line, hitting 8 out of nine, but yielded scoring honors to his running mate, Ronald Peters. Peters had 20 points, including eight field goals and four of six free throws. Warren Wilken was close behind with 14.

Dudley Doebele gunned the Elmwood attack with a 20-point performance. He matched Peters' performance with 8 field goals and 4 of 6 free throws. Merrill McCoy was next in line for Elmwood with 14 points.

Cole Equals Scoring Record In 64-28 Win

Stanley Cole unleashed a torrid 30-point scoring spree to tie a school record and lead his mates to a 64-28 win over undermanned Underwood here Monday.

The outcome was never in doubt after Plattsmouth opened with an 18-point first quarter. Underwood did not hit that point until the end of the third period.

Cole matched a scoring record of 30 points in a single game established by his brother, Sterling, set in 1945. Earlier this season Stan hit 29. Cole hit 14 field goals in tying the record.

The Blue Devils were in front 28-13 at halftime and led 44-19 going into the final period. Reserves saw heavy duty during much of the game.

Bob Wondra finally opened up with a 15 point scoring spree, his highest of the season. Gene Gates and Fred Larkin were high for Underwood with six points each.

Blue Devils Knocked From Conference Tourney 51-43

College View set the stage for a repeat performance of the 1951 season by dropping Plattsmouth from the East Seven Nebraska Conference tourney Wednesday night with a 51-43 win.

The win avenged an earlier conference loss to Plattsmouth and as a result, turned the tables around from a year ago. Last year the Blue Devils dropped College View from the tournament after losing a regular contest.

The Viewmen succeeded in shacking Plattsmouth's Stan Cole, a 22-point per game scorer until the Wednesday night battle, when he was held to 7 points.

At that the Blue Devils were in command throughout almost three quarters of play. Plattsmouth led 11-9 at the end of the first period and held a 26-21 margin at halftime.

College View rallied in the third period and was in front 38-37 going into the final quarter. Cole drew his fifth foul midway through the second half and the Blue Devils fell apart.

But with Cole unable to shake loose, a trio of Plattsmouth cagers attempted to bring home the bacon. Cliff Kennell found the range for five quick field goals in the second period from out court, but he failed to score afterwards.

College View's Clyde Cook was the scoring leader with 17 while his ruring mate Carlson had 15. Carlson and Moffitt teamed up for 10 points in the final quarter that ultimately resulted in the win.
