**Cotton Clothing
 Coming Under
 New Disguises**

Cotton clothing is coming to stores under a variety of disguises which keep it in the high fashion bracket even with the appearance of so many new fibers.

Mrs. Mary Guthrie of the University of Nebraska's home economics department says these are some of the cotton items you will find in stores: golden prints, taffeta finishes that rustle like paper and shiny satin finishes.

Tests have been conducted at Ohio State University to find out whether these new finishes would wash and clean satisfactorily. Here are some of the conclusions:

The gold print gradually disappears in both washing and cleaning, with some materials losing the print more quickly than others. Careful washing by hand is the best method. Ironing should be at a moderate temperature.

The satiny cotton kept its gle through many washings, dried quickly and was crush resistant. The taffetized cotton lost some of its sheen in laundering but was still attractive. It dried quickly but wrinkled easily, and the heavier the material, the harder the wrinkles were to remove.

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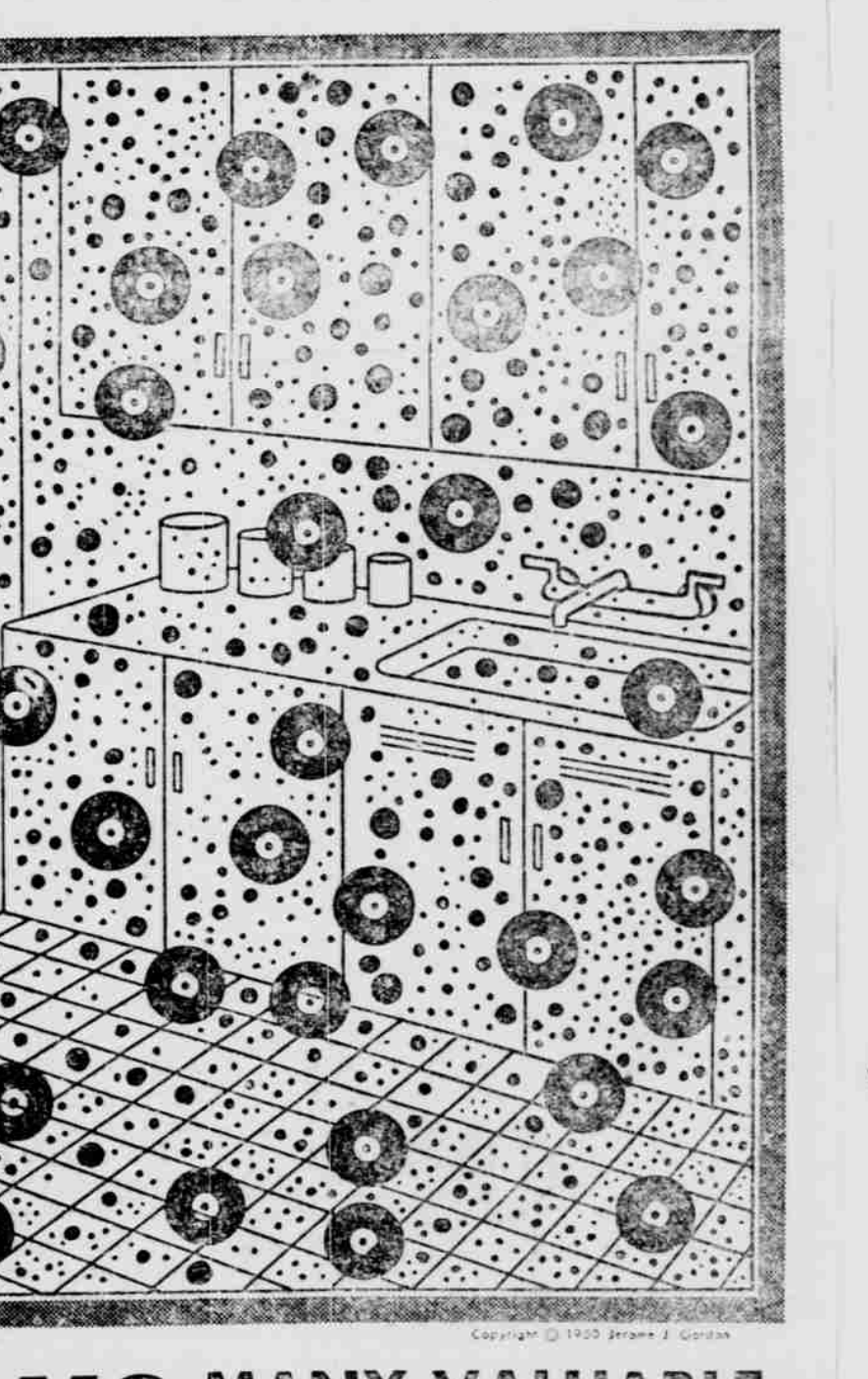
