Those factors, coupled with the heavier summer traffic, greatly increase the accident possibilities and should bring to the realization of all drivers, bicycle riders, and pedestrians that personal responsibility for safety in traffic is not to be taken lightly." As of June 12, the traffic toll stood at 119, 5 more than for the same date last year; a year, which in terms of lives lost, was the worst in Nebraska's traffic history. 


