Military procurement and construction totaled \$8,000,000,000 in this second quarter of this year, a gain of twenty per cent over the first three months, according to Dr. John R. Steelman, acting head of the Office of Defense Mobilization.

EDUCATIONAL COSTS

In its annual circular on expenditures per pupil in city school systems, covering the year 1950-51, the Office of Education found a \$6 drop in "actual education investment in each boy and girl" from the year before. The per-pupil educational expenditure in all towns of more than 2,500 population was \$229 in "uniform purchasing power dollars" as compared with \$229 for the previous year.
