dense the moisture, and then drain it off. Dehumidifiers are useful wherever condensation causes moisture damage. They should be used with doors and windows closed.

Silica gel, activated alumina, and the familiar calcium chloride, are chemicals that absorb moisture from the air, and sell in department or drug stores. Silica gel and activated alumina are not harmful to fabrics, hold moisture without dripping, may be dried out in a slow oven and used again and again. They may hang in cloth bags in closed closets or be placed in open containers on the floor or preferably a shelf in the closet.

Calcium chloride is cheaper and takes up more moisture than these newer chemicals. In fact, it holds twice its weight in water. But, as it absorbs moisture, it liquefies. It should not come in contact with clothing, household furnishings, floors or walls. To use, put the granular chloride on a nonrusting screen such as plastic screen, supported in a nonrusting container—enamelware, crockery or glass. Then place the open container in a closet and keep the door shut. When the calcium chloride becomes liquid, replace it with a fresh, dry supply.
