### Certification Of Potatoes Down

There will be about an eight per cent reduction in the acreage of certified seed potatoes this year compared with 1951, according to Max Koehnke of the Potato Certification Association. Planting of the late potato crop is about complete, he said, and the majority of the acreage entered for certification was in the ground between June 15-20. Most growers report good soil conditions with the exception of a few fields where a heavy growth of sweet clover was turned under. In this case farmers irrigated before planting. Mr. Koehnke said a total of 5,230 acres of potatoes have been offered for certification. Scotts Bluff and Box Butte are the two leading counties in the production of certified seed potatoes. These counties follow in order of acreage size: Sheridan, Banner, Kimball, Sioux, Keith, Morrill, Lincoln, Dawes and Dawson. He said the principal variety entered for certification still is Triumph. Progress, a relatively new variety, is steadily increasing in importance because of its success in table stock production in Nebraska and neighboring states.
