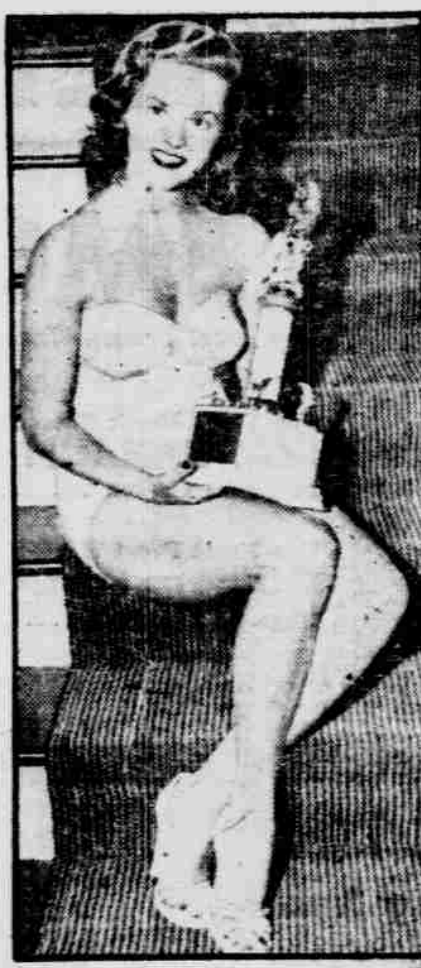

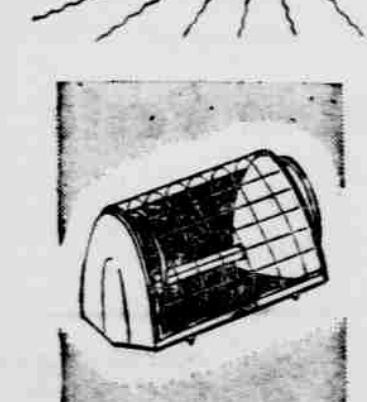

SCHOOL BOND ELECTION

School District of the City of Plattsmouth, In the County of Cass, In the State of Nebraska

Tuesday, September 30, 1952

Shall the School District of the City of Plattsmouth in the County of Cass in the State of Nebraska issue the bonds of said School District in the amount of \$450,000.00 bearing interest at a rate not to exceed three per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, and said bonds to be retired in not to exceed thirty years from the date of said bonds and all of said bonds shall be redeemable at the option of the School District at any time on or after five years from the date of issuance thereof as provided by law. The proceeds of said bonds to be used for the purpose of erecting and constructing school buildings and for the purpose of heating, ventilating and furnishing the necessary furniture and apparatus for the same, such school buildings to be as follows: a new elementary school building in the area of the First Ward School, a new elementary school building in the area of the Wintersteen School; a new elementary school building in the area of the Columbian School, and a new general purpose high school addition at Ninth and Main Streets, said school sites being within the corporate boundaries of said School District. Said bonds to be dated the 1st day of April, 1953, and

Shall said Board of Education of said School District cause to be levied annually as provided by law, against all the taxable property of said School District, a tax sufficient for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds as the same become due and to provide for a sinking fund.
