In making decisions on the use of the powers he has authority to use, the President must judge carefully whether or not the majority of the people give support to his decisions.

For al lhis power, the President of the United States cannot abridge the power of the Congress; he cannot escape the fact that the people choose a President each four years; he cannot avoid the threat that too unpopular a decision might create a universal demand for his impeachment. For all his vast power there are checks and balances he cannot escape considering when he makes a decision on the use of his pow-

In addition, over the 163 vears since President George Washington took office, the power of the office has been augumented year after year, by new laws creating new powers, and new court decisions extending the limits of his powers under old laws. Candidates have continually expressed a desire to limit the powers of the office, but successive President, whether Democratii or Republican, have found it necessary to expand the powers of the office to meet changing situations.


