

15 Days Remain To Send Christmas Gifts Overseas

Only fifteen days remain for sending overseas packages to servicemen with American forces in distant points of the globe, if delivery of those packages is to be guaranteed by the postal department.

Post office authorities have guaranteed to make delivery of overseas Christmas packages if mailed on or before November 15, 1952. With the first of November now at hand, parents, relatives and friends are reminded that they might be too late in mailing packages to overseas servicemen unless they are motivated to action soon.

But aside from packages,

other Christmas remembrances to America's fighting forces, or those on maneuvers or with occupation forces might be in the form of a simple Christmas card, a long personal letter or through some means of similar communication.

To enable countians to send such greetings, the Journal submits its third list of servicemen and their addresses, so that friends and relatives of the servicemen may have such information available as they prepare their Christmas greeting list.

Additional lists will be published with each issue of the Journal as long as addresses of servicemen are available.

If you know of a serviceman's address that has not been published as yet, simply write the name and address on a post card and mail it to the Plattsmouth Journal, call the address in by phone or deliver it personally to the Journal office. Names will be published as soon as possible after receipt.

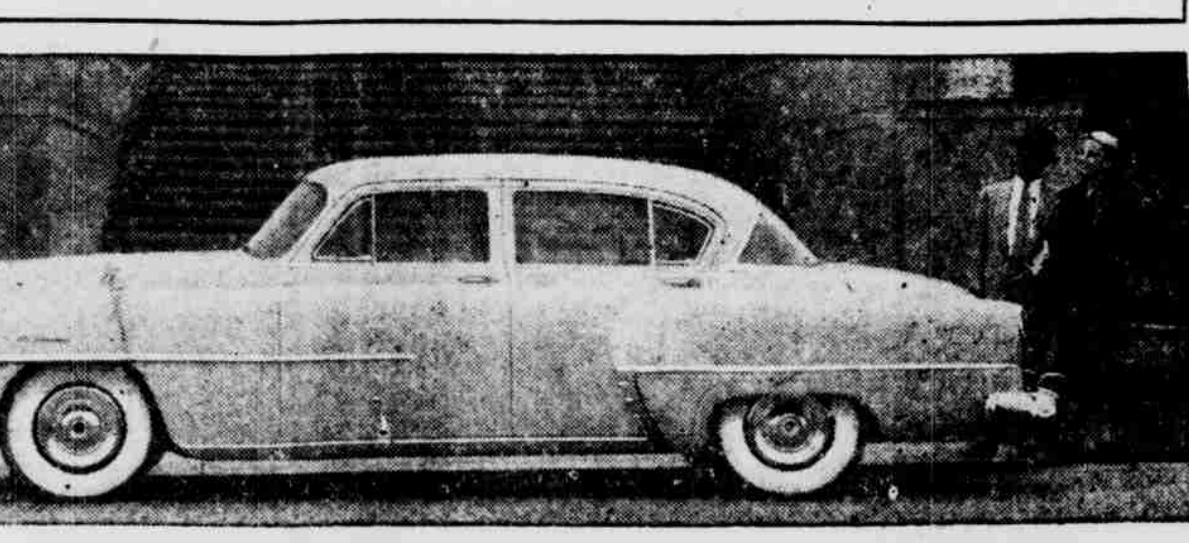

property taxes may be authorized by law. Existing revenue laws shall continue in effect until changed by the Legislature."

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Quail Season Opens Saturday In Cass County

Nebraska's hunting becomes more diversified at sunrise Saturday, November 1 as the state's 23-day long quail season gets under way in 30 counties and part of five others in southeast Nebraska.

At this time, Nebraskans are already hunting pheasants in most of the state and ducks, geese, coot, rabbits, squirrels, raccoon and opossum in all of Nebraska. The state has concluded its grouse season which ran October 11 to 15.

Quail hunters are encouraged by Game Commission investigations which indicate good hunting. Summer checks show a quail population slightly below that of last year, but higher than that of 1950.

The northern and western parts of the open zone appear to have more quail than a year ago while the southeastern counties have less. The population is apparently more evenly distributed within the open zone than a year ago.

Hunters will undoubtedly be spending most of their field hours in areas where there is a combination of suitable woody cover (hedgerows and weedy

fence rows) and food (foxtail, seeds, weed seeds and some corn).

Quail generally leave their roosting areas in mid-morning, traveling via travel lanes (hedgerows, etc.) to feeding areas after which they go to loafing cover. They return to feed in mid-afternoon and then back to the roosting areas.

More dogs will be used in quail hunting than in hunting of any other game species in the state. Many hunters consider dogs as a "must" in quail hunting. Using dogs not only expedites finding the birds, but also limits lost birds and adds to the sport.

It is with dogs however, that quail hunting will suffer unless rain falls soon. Most dogs are unable to pick up scent when such dry conditions prevail.

The quail season runs through November 23. Hunting hours are sunrise to one hour before sunset. Bag limit is seven birds as is the possession limit.

Open area includes Cass, Douglas, Nemaha, Otoe, Sarpy and Saunders counties.
