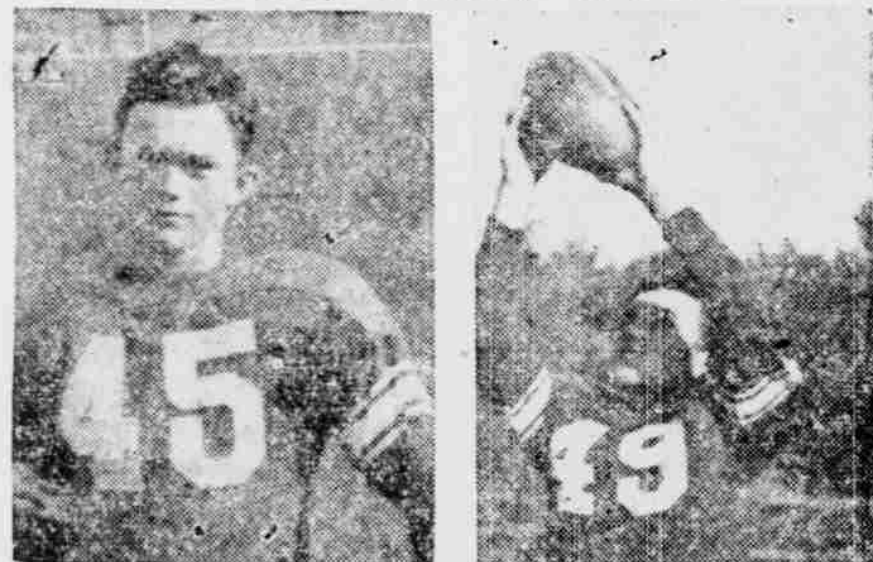


Noell's 64-Yard Run Nets Win

Blotzer, Noell Score



Capping gridiron careers at Plattsmouth high school Friday night were seniors, John Blotzer and DeWayne Noell. Both scored touchdowns in leading Plattsmouth to a 13-6 conference win over Bellevue. Blotzer drove 13 yards for his six pointer early in the game to put the Blue Devils out in front, while Noell capped his career and the grid season with a 64-yard jaunt.

Hot & Cold Packs Mend Ankle; Platters Win 13-6

Hot and cold packs were the answer Friday night as Plattsmouth ended the 1952 grid campaign with a 13-6 win over Bellevue. The packs were applied for two days to doubtful starter, DeWayne Noell, whose injured ankle held up for 64 long yards, as the Murray speedster climaxed the season with an off-tackle drive that ended with the Blue Devils second touchdown. Earlier John Blotzer had given Plattsmouth a 6-0 lead as he ground out the last 13 yards in an early Plattsmouth first quarter touchdown. Jon Schuetz plunged for the extra point. But a second period pass from Hassel to Sands, good for 44 yards had moved the count to 6-7, with the Devils holding a one-point lead. That set the stage for Noell's dramatic run. Noell was listed as a doubtful starter, and wasn't even considered for a part-time job Friday night after he sprained an ankle during mid-week practice. But Coach Merle Stewart recommended the hot and cold packs, and at game time, with the leg tightly wrapped, Noell was ready to go, as he proved following the intermission. Noell was used offensively during the entire contest. The run was the second longest of the season for Plattsmouth and Noell, who had an 82-yard run against Westside several weeks ago. Another Plattsmouth drive was earmarked touchdown in the final quarter, only to evaporate when Bellevue covered a Plattsmouth fumble on the 20. That put the Blue Devils on the defensive throughout the remainder of the game as Bellevue took to the air and rapidly moved from its own 20 yard line to the Plattsmouth 35 as time ran out. A blocked punt actually led to Plattsmouth's first marker in the opening period. Linebacker Willard Christenson crashed through to block the punt. Afforded the Plattsmouth offensive failed to go the distance, Bellevue kicked out, and the Devils roared back with Blotzer covering the last 13 yards. Another Plattsmouth play, marked touchdown, had the crowd on its feet late in the final period, when a Tom Conis pass was dropped after the in-

tended receiver had slipped behind the Bellevue defenders. Last game of the season for the Plattsmouth gridgers, the win gave the Devils a record of 4-5, for the season and a 4-2 conference record. The Devils finished third in the conference behind Blair and Wahoo.

The Friday night classic was even statistically as it was in score. Both teams came through with 9 first downs, while net yardage was 223 yards for Plattsmouth and 267 yards for Bellevue.
