Power Off for Fifteen Hours At Weeping Water

Weeping Water was without electricity for 15 hours and 10 minutes during the storm. Electric service failed at 4:45 p.m. Tuesday and wasn't restored until 7:55 a.m. Wednesday. According to Floyd Hite, local manager of OPPD, the fifteen hours and 10 minutes was the longest that Weeping Water has been without electrical service since 1923.

Mr. Hite said the electrical trouble was centered near Pappillon. Local residents were using candles, kerosene lamps, lanterns and flashlights. The women did what cooking they could on their heating stoves.

Huge drifts of snow blocked almost every road leading into Weeping Water. Highway 59 south of Weeping Water was opened Thursday afternoon. Lots of the side roads were not opened until Saturday.

There was no school in Weeping Water Wednesday.

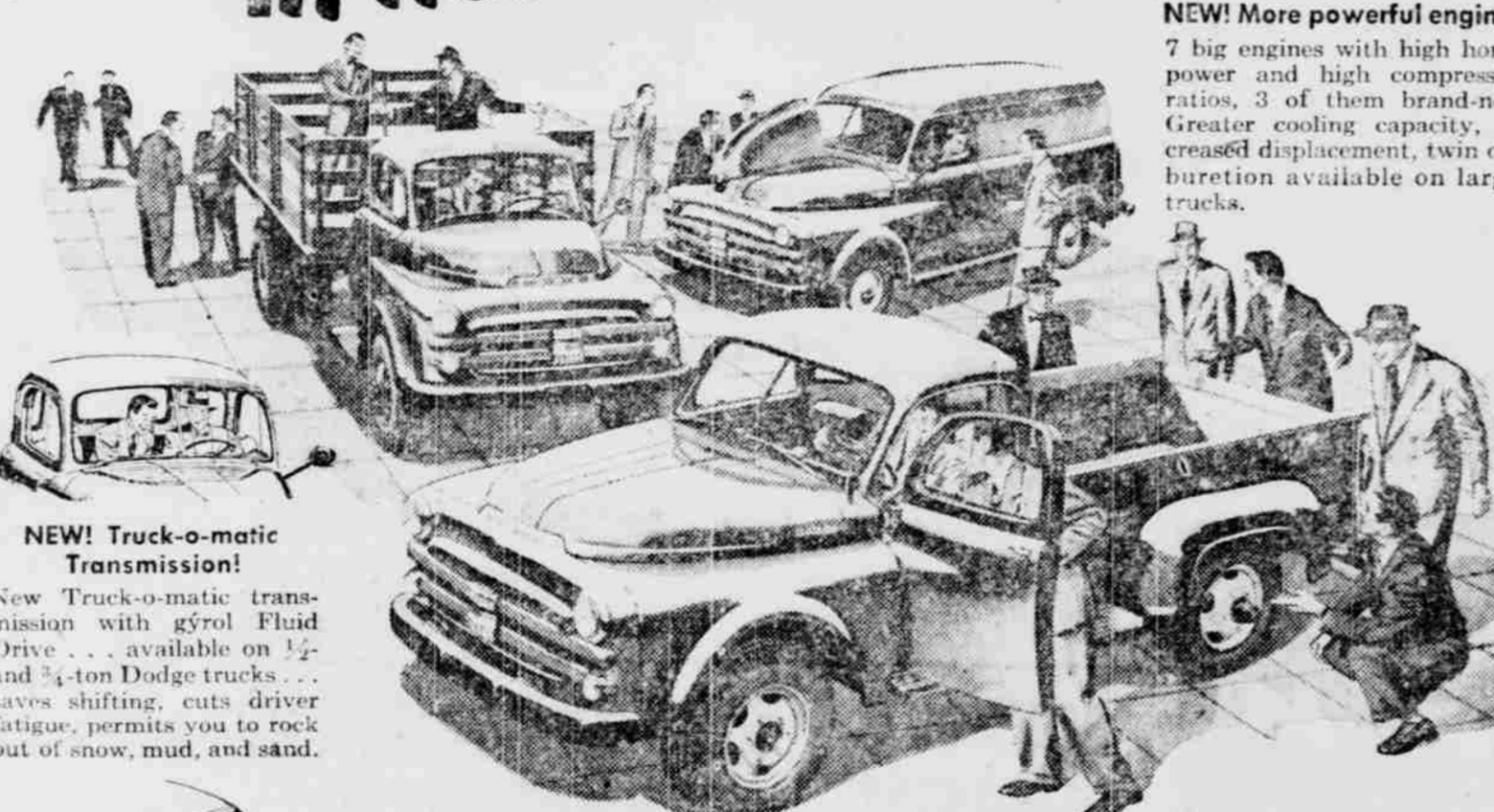
