Miss Hazel Tubbs of Lincoln was a dinner guest Sunday at the E. L. McDonald home.

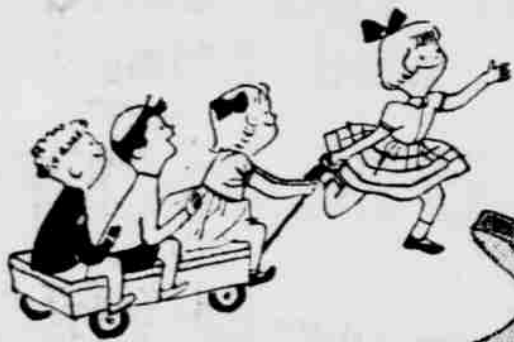
