Smith of Los Angeles, California, and Frank M. and John Jr. of Plattsmouth, and one daughter, Mrs. Harold Seay of Plattsmouth. One daughter, Lucille, and two sons, Evan and William, preceded her in death.

Other survivors are her husband, John; two brothers, Thomas Henderson of Lincoln and William Henderson of Lexington, Mo.; eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at St. John's Catholic church Tuesday morning at 9 a. m. with Msgr. George Agius officiating. Visiting hour will be held Monday afternoon and evening from 3 to 6 and 7 to 8 with Rosary at 8 p. m. Burial will be in Holy Sepulchre cemetery at Plattsmouth.

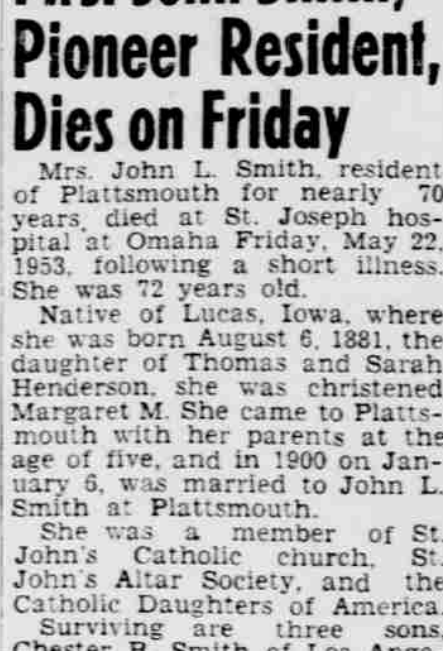
Defendant Enjoined From Building Garage On Curb
