Honorees also include Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Friedrich of Plainview, Mrs. Friedrich is a sister of W. H. Meisinger.

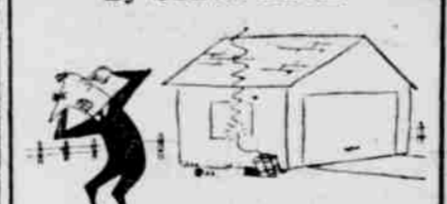
