The project consists of constructing the following approximate quantities:

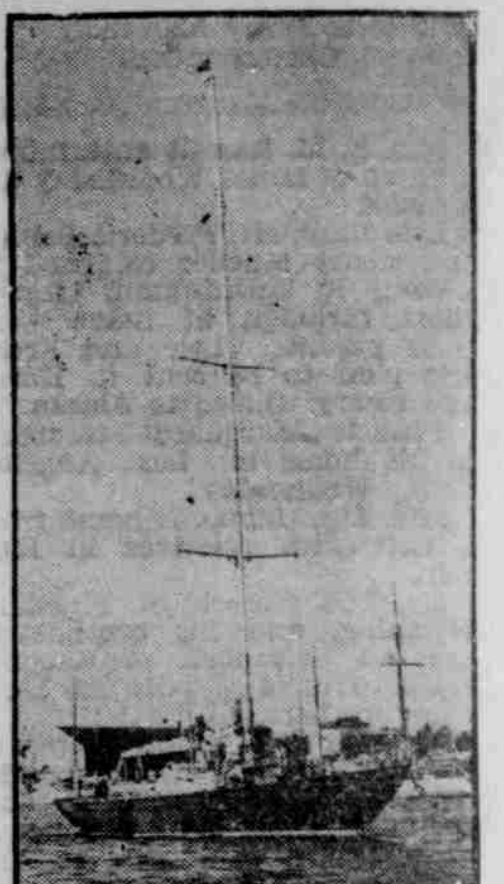
