Founding Of First Cass Ag Society Is Explained

The first agriculture association in Cass county was an act to incorporate the Cass County Agriculture Society by the legislature assembled in the Omaha, the state capitol of Nebraska Territory, according to findings of Miss Evelyn Wolph of Nehawka.

At the session the legislative

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group resolved that "be it enacted by the council of the Territory of Nebraska, that H. C. Wolph, John F. Buck, C. W. Moore, Hon. A. Towler, William Young, Augustus Case, Thomas S. Gaskill, Levi G. Todd, Broad Cole, John Carroll, Wm. H. Davis and Joseph Vanhorn hereby declared the body incorporate

"At least five of the above named incorporators shall meet at the town of Rock Bluffs in Cass county and proceed to organize said society, by electing a president, secretary, treasurer and board of managers and adopt a constitution and by-laws," the legislative group ruled.

To join the Society, a membership fee of from one to five dollars was assessed. The society was incorporated on January 24, 1856.

H. C. Wolph came to Nebraska Territory May 27, 1854, and is the grandfather of Miss Evelyn Wolph who has been noted over the county as a 4-H leader at Nehawka for over 30 years. Miss Wolph is helping to carry out the wishes of her grandfather, who nearly one hundred years ago was chairman of the first Agriculture Society in the county.

Miss Wolph provided the county ag society background during a recent address before the Cass County Historical Society. She explained also that her grandfather had also helped establish Doane College at Crete and served as a representative in the territorial and state legislatures.
