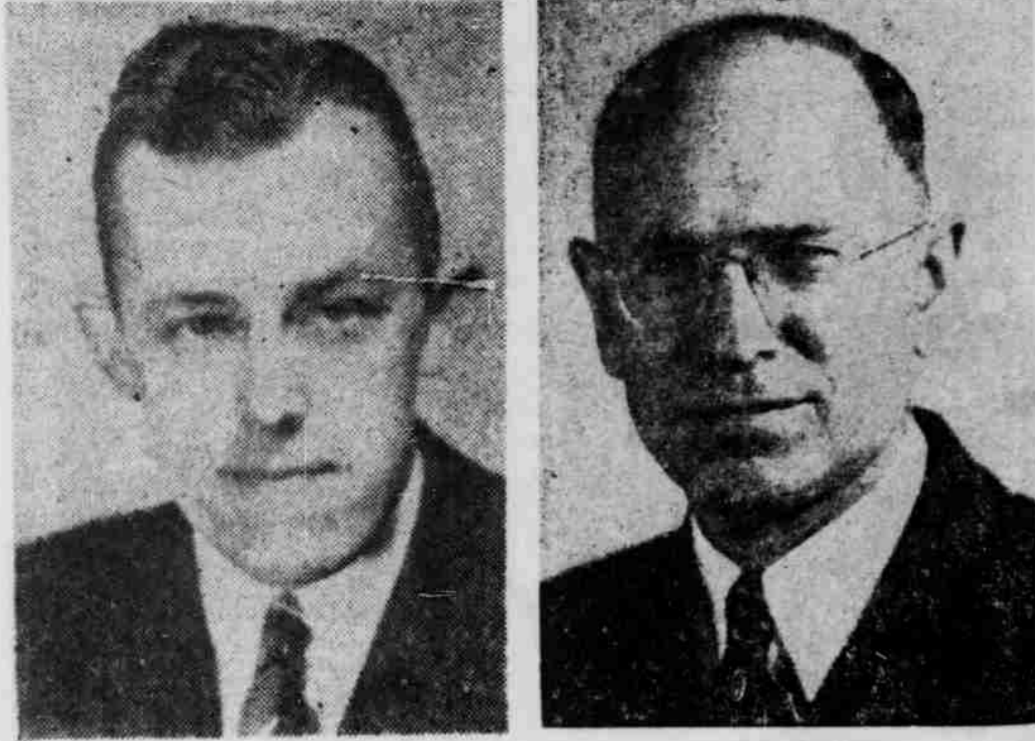


### School Administrators

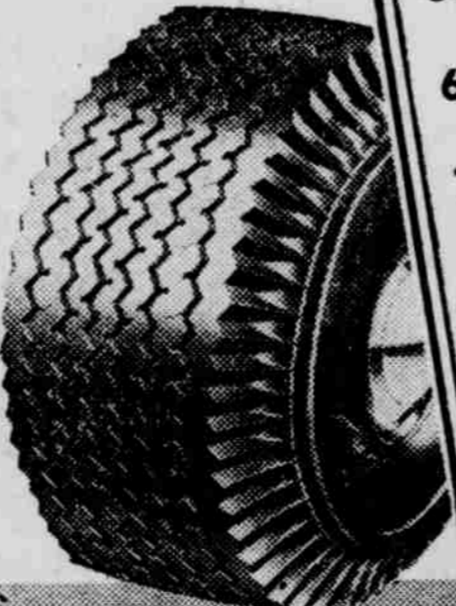
