ORDINANCE NO. 67
Record of the Meeting of the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Nehawka, Nebraska for the Purpose of Passing Ordinance No. 67 and Transacting Other Business Incidental Thereto.

Nehawka, Nebraska
September 10, 1953
The special meeting of the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Nehawka, Nebraska, was held at the meeting place of said Board at the date aforesaid.

The Chairman directed the Clerk to call the roll, which was done and the following members of the Board were shown to be present, to-wit:

Present: G. A. Rutledge, G. A. Edmonds, R. Switzer, W. S. Power. Absent: A. A. McReynolds.

The Chairman announced that a quorum was present and the Board was qualified to carry out any business that might come before it. Whereupon Trustee R. Switzer introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance authorizing the purchase of an oil burning furnace to replace the coal furnace in the village auditorium; declaring that an emergency exists; providing for the payment of said improvement out of the general fund; giving chairman of Board of Trustees and Village Clerk authority to act and to prescribe the time when the ordinance shall be in full force and effect."

Said ordinance was read by title on its first reading and on a motion duly made and carried was assigned as Trustee and 67 of said Village, passed and its title approved. Whereupon Trustee G. A. Edmonds moved that the statutory ruling requiring the reading of an ordinance on three different days be dispensed with, which motion was seconded by Trustee R. Switzer and the roll was called on the adoption of said motion and the Trustees present voted as follows:

Yeas: Switzer, Edmonds and Power.
Nays: None.

Said motion having been concurred in by three-fourths of the Trustees present was by the Chairman of the Board declared passed and adopted.

Second Reading: Thereupon Ordinance No. 67 was read by its title a second time, and upon question by the Chairman of the Board, "Shall Ordinance No. 67 be passed and adopted?" The yeas and nays were called and the Trustees present voted as follows:

Yeas, Switzer, Edmonds and Power.
Nays: None.

Third Reading: Thereupon Ordinance No. 67 was read at large on third reading and put upon final passage. The Chairman of the Board stated that the question is, "Shall Ordinance No. 67 be passed and adopted?" Yeas, Switzer, Edmonds and Power.

Nays: None.
The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members elected to the Board, said ordinance was by the Chairman of the Board declared passed and adopted and the Chairman by Trustee R. Switzer and Board of Trustees signed and approved said ordinance.

Ordinance No. 67
An ordinance authorizing the purchase of an oil burning furnace to replace the coal furnace in the village auditorium; declaring that an emergency exists; providing for the payment of said improvement out of the general fund; giving chairman of Board of Trustees and Village Clerk authority to act and to prescribe the time when the ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

Be it ordained by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Nehawka, Nebraska: Section 1: There is hereby declared to be a public emergency in the village of Nehawka resulting from the breakdown of the heating system in the public auditorium located in said village, which system must be replaced before cold weather, and therefore the requirements of obtaining estimates of costs and advertisement for bids is hereby waived.

Section 2: The Chairman of the Board of Trustees and the Village Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the purchase of an oil burning furnace with a heating capacity of 2,200 square feet, complete with automatic controls, combination water feeder and law water cut off and a 1,000 gallon fuel storage tank together with all the necessary electrical wiring, materials and labor.

Section 3: The cost of the new heating system shall be paid out of the general fund of the village of Nehawka, Nebraska.

Section 4: This ordinance shall take effect after passage by a three-fourths vote of the Board of Trustees and upon the proclamation of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and shall be posted in three of the most public places of said village.

Section 5: All ordinances or parts of ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage and approval of this ordinance, and in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
