Placing salt on new paving to rid the streets of water's ice and snow damages the pavement. That was the advice of Special City Engineers Henningsen, Durham and Richardson to the city council.
The engineers explained that use of salt for eliminating ice and snow tends to make the pavement scale and to destroy its permeability.
While the city doesn't use salt, but prefers sand, there is some possibility that residents may use salt on the streets for their individual troubles. The city asks cooperation of residents along new paving to refrain from the use of salt for at least two years.

Countians Have Livestock on Omaha Market
Omaha Monday opened an eighth successive week as ton-ranking livestock market. In contract to a week earlier, Monday trade at Omaha was steady to higher.
Cattle and calves sold strong to 50 cents higher, some up more; butcher hogs bulked at \$21-\$21.25; and fat lambs cleared at \$17-\$19.

Spangler, 11 hogs weighing 212 at \$21; Myron Wiles, 20 steers weighing 1049 at \$25; Schneider & Peterson, 20 hogs weighing 212 at \$22.90; Boedecker and Cottingham, 21 steers weighing 1140 at \$27.55; and Clyde Redding, 21 hogs weighing 234 at \$21.25.
