**23rd Amendment Designed Protect Individual Rights**

Protection of the individual rights is the basic reason back of a proposed amendment to the United States constitution. County Attorney Richard Peck told Plattsmouth Rotary club members here Tuesday noon.

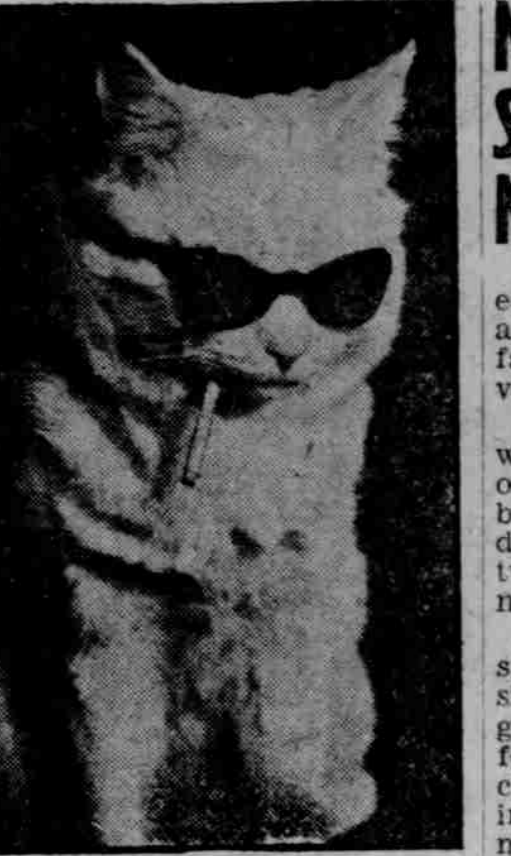
A guest of Rotary Program Chairman Dick Spangler, the county attorney outlined provisions of the proposed amendment as submitted in the Bricker Resolution, sponsored in the Senate by Senator John Bricker of Ohio, and backed by 63 United States Senators.

Bricker's resolution, fathered by the American Bar Association and Frank Holman, Seattle attorney, proposes to close loopholes which at the present time enable the executive branch of the federal government to make treaties with the countries that violate rights of the individual.

The proposed amendment would not alter current constitutional law governing treaties, but would further provide that portions of treaties violating the individual's rights would be invalid.

Peck explained that dozens of organizations including the American Legion, A.M.A., and labor organizations are also backing the proposed 23rd amendment to the constitution.

Rotarians were also introduced to two new Junior Rotarians for the month of November. They are Michael Shellenbarger, high school junior, and Donald Hutchinson, senior.
