TO SUBSIDIZE WHEAT EXPORTS

A new subsidy program designed to increase wheat exports has been announced by the Agriculture Department. The Commodity Credit Corporation will offer for immediate sale "a limited quantity" of Government-owned wheat for export, in addition to the wheat moving under the International Wheat Agreement. As of Oct. 1, the C.C.C. owned about 464,000,000 bushels of wheat acquired through price support.
