Ptak, Finnefrock Glow In Opening Cage Battle

Jim Jacques' height, Denny Ptak's left hand, Byron Finnefrock's scrappiness, and Jon Schuetz's savvy were the ingredients used to produce a 56-38 win for the Plattsmouth Blue Devils in their opening games Friday night against Omaha Westside.

They were four of the eight cagers to score for Coach Merle Stewart as the Devils opened the season and conference with a win. Jim Graves, Stuart Nielsen, Jacques and Wood and Larry Pierce also scored as Plattsmouth forged an early lead and was never threatened.

Jacques and Finnefrock led the early Plattsmouth attack as the Devils moved out front 17-6. Jacques had his 16 points in that first period, while Finnefrock was contributing five. Jon Schuetz, Wood and Ptak carried the load in the second period as Plattsmouth went off the floor leadings 27-20 at half time.

Jacques and Nielsen returned to the fore in the third fourth before Jacques drew his fourth foul. He sat out most of the second half as Stewart substituted freely, while Finnefrock and Stuart Nielsen manned the center post.

After racing to a 36-25 third period margin, Plattsmouth took off in the final period with Denny Ptak, Nielsen and Larry Pierce leading the attack. Ptak had three field goals in the final period as he took second place in scoring honors for Plattsmouth with 11.

It was Finnefrock's under the basket work, along with Ptak's left-handed layups that sparked Plattsmouth's final quarter bid, while Stuart Nielsen showed scoring ability in the closing minutes.

Fifteen Plattsmouth cagers saw action as Stewart substituted freely in the final period. Forward Bob Price led the invaders with 12 points while Center Gary Rosenbaum connected for 11. They were the only consistent scorers for Westside.

Center—Jim Edwards, College View and Bob Gade, Ashland. Backs—Gary Hoffman, Wahoo; Jim Baird, Westside; Lowell Paine, Blair; Dave Heckenlively, Westside and Lyle McCallen, Valley. Blair was awarded the conference trophy for its undefeated season and final standings were confirmed. Coaches also voted to conduct pairings for next year's Jamboree on the basis of final standings with the number 1 team playing number 2 and so on.
