Bible Comment:

THE history of religious worship among all peoples provides an array of strange, amazing, incongruous and even tragic facts.

It has been marked by all manner of superstitions and correspondingly devious practices, night and returned home Thurs-even among cultured peoples. It has been accompanied by cruel human sacrifices, obscene practices and animal sacrifice. But the highest form of true worship found expression in ex-periences of which the 139th

Psalm is typical: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my thoughts; and see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

Such a spirit in worship, wherever it is manifest, transcends all rituals and forms. Rituals and forms have reality only when they are the symbols and accompaniments of an earnest quest of God and the way of truth and right.

It is obvious that worship with many in all branches of religions is a formal matter, little related to righteousness and zeal in daily

life. Vast numbers today do not attend religious services, or practice worship. But does anyone imagine that the forces of gambling, political corruption and debauchery have been, or are, confined to the churchless and irreligious?

Often, the worst people in a community are to be found using the cloak of religious formalism to cover up their evil.

Worship is meaningless unless we remember that "God is a Spirit, and they that worship Him must worship in spirit and in truth."

That is the everlasting word against all pretense and formalism.
