The Devils finished in 8th place in the ten team Class A bracket with 9 points. Falls City topped entries with 80 1/3 points.

Aside from Falls City and North, strong A teams, the Class B teams were evenly spotted along the line.

England picked up three points for Plattsmouth as he turned in the best mile performance of his three year career.

The mile relay team finished fourth in the good time of 3:54 and the 880-yard relay team held down fourth place in 1:41.6. Both performances, however, were well below the Devils top performances.
