Ron Luce, Avoca, Rates Chance in 880

Ron Luce of Avoca and Tom Johnson of Nehawka will be among the state Class D leaders to compete in the state track meet at Lincoln this week-end.

Luce, a repeater from last year rates among the top half milers in the state. He earned a trip to Lincoln for the state track carnival by winning the Class D half mile at the Peru district meeting last week. Luce was clocked in 2:08.1.

Johnson qualified in both the discus and shot events. His 42 feet 4 inch toss of the 12 pound ball rated second in the district meet, while he hurled the discus 111 feet 5 inches for second.

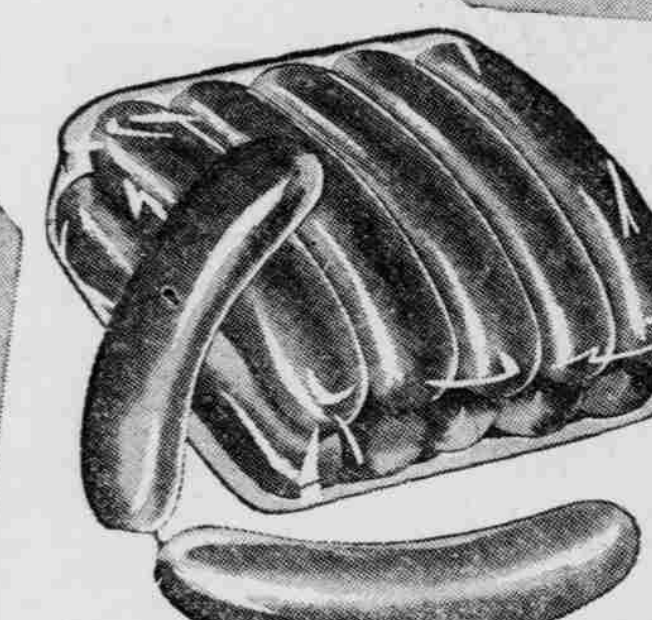
