## Munn School Former Teachers, Pupils Are Feted by Balfours

Three of Carl Balfour's teachers and the years they taught at district were Mrs. Laura Hall Stone, 1898-1899. Mrs. Stone was a pupil and teacher of this school. Mrs. Amelia Nutzman Balfour taught this school three years, 1906-1909. Mrs. Harvey Barkhurst taught in 1915. Those present who attended school with Mrs. Carl Balfour were Mrs. Minnie Steele, Walthill, Nebr.; Harvey Barkhurst, Adolph and Martin Ross.

Mrs. Balfour's invitations featured a school house. The table decoration was a replica of a small country school, surrounded with a hedge and with the teacher and pupils in front, the flag was also displayed. Mrs. Harvey Barkhurst led in the Doxology before the dinner. Of interest to the guests were the memories which included pictures of the school and pupils of many years ago and cards with all the grades and the names of the pupils in each grade. Representing the Munn family, for whom the school was named, were Delbert Munn, Mrs. Maude Giles, Mrs. Ola Davis and Mrs. Laura Deles Demier. About the year 1902 and for many years after this school was the meeting place of a literary society. Members came from miles around each Tuesday evening and presented very educational programs. There were always 100 or more present. In 1903 the late Roy Giles was president and Mrs. Amelia Nutzman Balfour was secretary. The building was also used for the Good Will Sunday school and church service from 1902 to 1914. The Methodist minister of Nehawka served.
