### Grain Bins Should Be Readied For New Wheat and Oats Crops

Now is the time to prepare grain bins for the new crop of wheat and oats which will be pouring in during the next few weeks.  
Wheat in a bin is like money in an vault—it must be protected and preserved if losses are to be avoided. Insects in farm-stored wheat cost Nebraska farmers huge sums of money every year. In the case of oats, the germination of seed many also be seriously damaged by slight heating of the grain in the bin. These losses are preventable. Permitting or encouraging such losses is pure waste.  
Insects in stored wheat hit the farmer in two ways: First, some of the wheat is actually destroyed by the insects. Second, some of it is made unfit for human consumption. Insect infested wheat or that contaminated by rats, mice, or bird may bring only feed grain prices at the elevator. Weevil infested grain is not accepted by millers for processing into flour, cereal and other food products.  
Wheat seldom contains insects when it comes from the harvest field. The job is to keep it free of insects, rats, mice and birds when it is stored. To protect the money represented by wheat in the bin, do these things:  
1. Before storing the grain, get rid of insects living in the bin or near it. Clean up. Remove all remnants of old grain, as well as livestock or poultry feeds, old sacks and similar harboring places for insects.  
2. Clean up outside of the bin. Remove old grain that has been spilled around the doorway or leaked through cracks.  
3. Spray bins, outside and inside, with an insecticide. A 2 1/2 per cent solution of either DDT, methorychlor or TDE is suggested. Apply at the rate of two gallons per 1,000 square feet of area.  
4. Store only dry grain. For safe storage the moisture content of wheat should not exceed 12 1/2%. Oats should not exceed 13% moisture. Keep the grain dry by providing a tight bin.  
5. Rat proof buildings and bins. The more that can be done to rat proof bins, granaries and other farm buildings the greater the success in rat and mouse control. Screen windows or bin sides to keep out birds.  
6. As an added protection against insects a protective powder composed of pyrethrin and piperonyl butoxide may be used.

This product is available under a commercial trade name.  
7. Inspect the wheat regularly after storage. If protective insect control powder is not used, a fumigation within six weeks after storage is desirable.  
Complete information on the care of stored grain will be found in either of two new circulars: U.S.D.A. Leaflet 345, "Insects in Farm Stored Wheat—How to Control Them;" or North Central Regional Publication No. 49, "Control of Stored Grain Insects."
