All teachers in the public schools of Cass County will be notified by County Superintendent L. H. Behrends, of the new wording of the "Pledge of Allegiance" to the Flag at convocation here August 30th.

The pledge usually opens classes in the lower grades of public schools.  
The new wording:  
"I Pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation UNDER GOD indivisible with liberty and justice for all."

The words "Under God" capitalized in the above copy is the new wording.
