Heier Family Reunion Held Sunday Murdock High School Gym

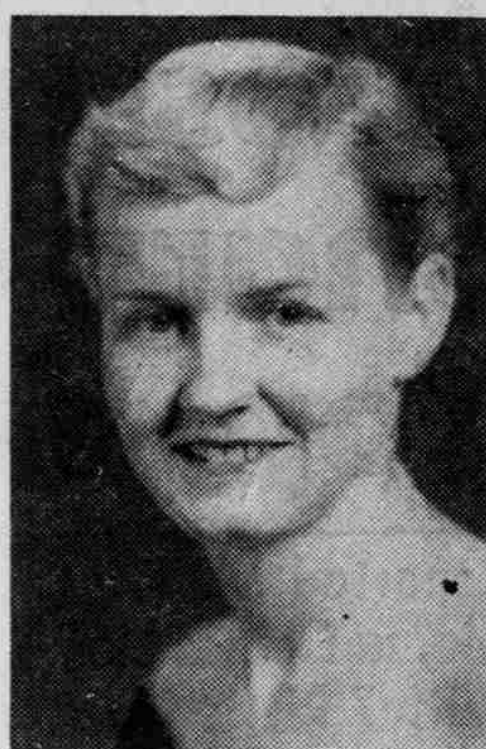
