The council also promised the aid of policemen and street department personnel in control of traffic during the Carnival.

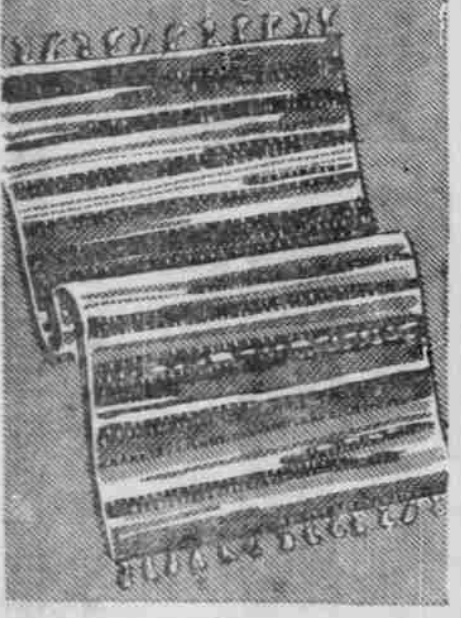
In other action, the council granted permission to Don Skalak on north 11th street, and to Helen Eiting on north 6th street, to cut curbing for installation of driveways.

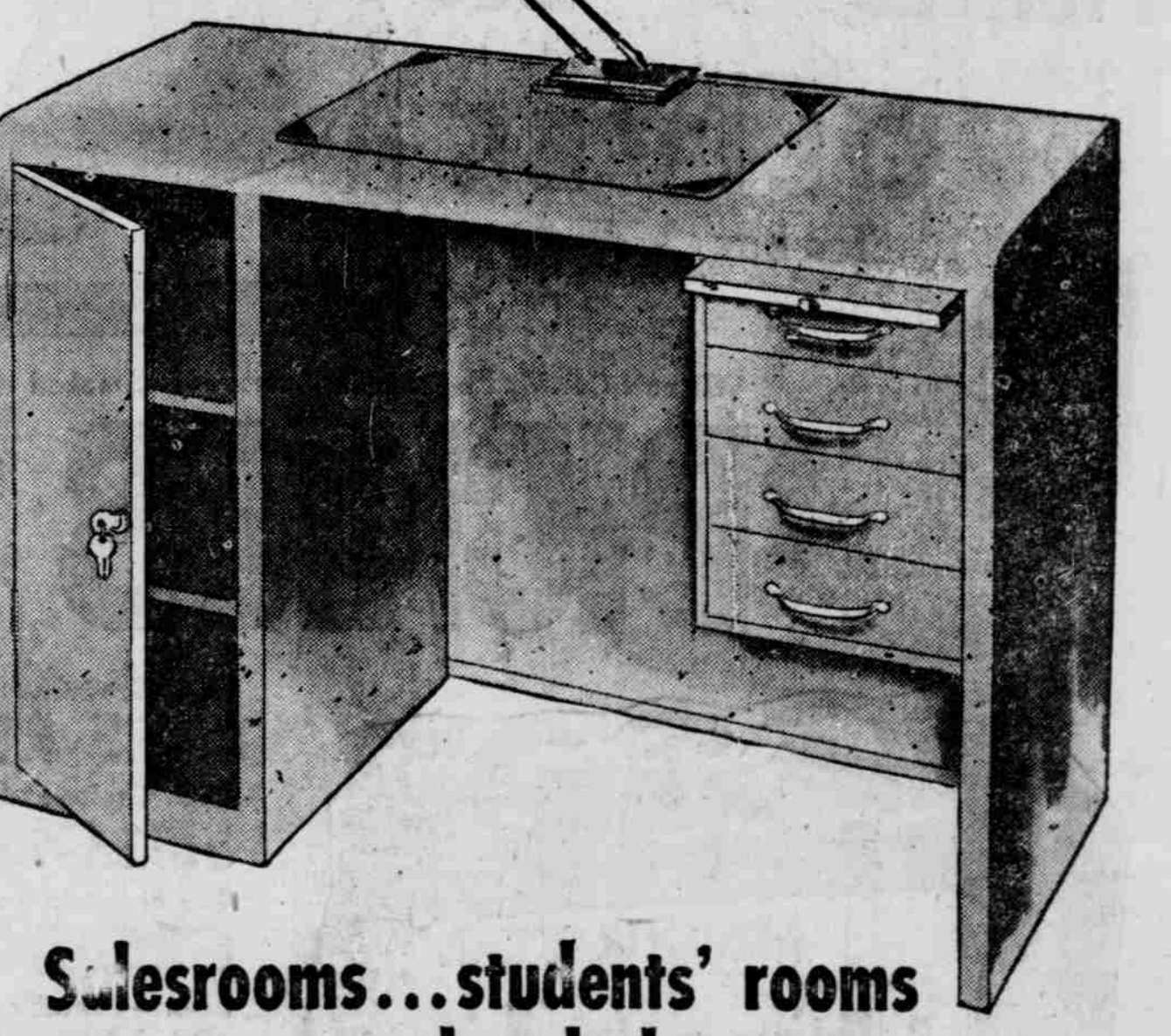
