Knabe Service Was Sunday At Nehawka

Fern Margaret Knabe, daughter of Ed and Julia Gansamer, was born on July 5, 1903 in Mount Pleasant Precinct - North West of Murray, Nebraska, and departed this life at Emanuel Lutheran Hospital in Omaha, Nebraska, on October 7, 1954 having attained the age of 51 years 3 months and 2 days.

She attended the home country grade school. Her first two years of high school was spent in Duchesne High School and College in Omaha; the two years of high school she attended the Plattsmouth Public School, graduating in 1922.

She attended Nebraska Wesleyan University in Lincoln for two full terms. After college she taught the home country school the winter of 1924 - 25; following this she taught for two years in the Nehawka public schools.

On September 6, 1903 she was baptized by Rev. Sprigle, pastor of the Evangelic Lutheran Church. She joined the First Presbyterian church at Plattsmouth in 1921 and transferred by letter to the First Methodist Church in Nehawka on December 27, 1931 remaining not only a continuous, but also a very active member until her death.

On September 12, 1927 she was united in marriage to Henry M. Knabe at Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and they moved to the Knabe home place which was homesteaded by Harry's grandfather in 1854.

She spent the remainder of her life on this farm where her greatest joy was her family, her home, her yard, flowers and garden. This union was blessed by three children, one daughter Ruth Harriet passing away in infancy on December 3, 1928.

Fern's first concern was always for her husband, children, loved ones and friends. All who knew her, loved her for her unselfishness, kindness and loving devotion.
