Robert Beins, Street wtrk 117.60 Statistics recently published by 3.30 the U. S. Department of Agri-culture show that brucellosis, anthrax, mastitis, cattle grubs, 87.90 lice, screw worms, and other livestock diseases and parasites cost the U.S. livestock industry more than \$21/2 billion every year.

"Much of this loss might have been prevented by veterinary diagnosis and treatment," said a Foundation spokesman. Where we can't protect animals by vaccination and other preventive medication, we must protect them by good management and be ready to safeguard the rest of the herd whenever a sick animal is detected."
