Legislative SIDELIGHTS..

How Do You Rate?
If suddenly you and your neighbors had to submit to an inclusive questionnaire to prove your good citizenship as an American and as a Nebraskan, how would you rate?

Citizenship in a democracy is largely measured by performance of a few simple duties. How do you stack up in answering the following questions?

The highest score any person can make is 100 per cent. The points awarded for your answers are indicated after each question. If you score 60 you are a "better-than-average" citizen.

1. Did you vote November 2? (Give yourself 10 points for a "yes")

2. Did you vote at the last primary election? (Ten points for "yes" here).

3. Did you vote in your last special local election? (Ten points for "yes")

4. Do you help get others to the polls by urging them to vote, discussing issues or by other means? (You can give yourself five points for a "yes" answer).

5. Can you name the Nebraska senators and the four representatives? (You may have one point for each senator, five points for the representative of your district and one point for each other representative).

6. Do you know how your senators voted on any important bill in the last session of Congress. (Here is an easy 10 points if you know).

7. Do you know how your representative voted on an important bill in the last session of Congress. (You can add an

easy 5 points here).

8. Can you present a good argument for or against major legislation considered by Congress — the Eisenhower farm program, Social Security for farmers, the Agriculture Trade Development Law, etc. (You can add five points if you can do this).

9. Do you know at least three of the rights guaranteed to you as an American by the Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the United States? (A quick way to add five points to your score).

10. Have you done any work in either political party, ever attended a caucus or other meeting of the party; rang doorbells; or made a speech in behalf of your party? (A "yes" here is really worth 10 points).

Profit Margins To Be Smaller, Experts Say

Profit margins will be narrower in 1955 for the beef producer, but a sufficient feed supply the country over and the prospect for a decrease in unemployment point to a stable cattle market for 6 to 10 months.

In an interview in the November issue of Capper's Farmer, farm management experts said the cattle price outlook for 1955 is only "a little less favorable" than last year.

Cattle prices in 1955 should approximately duplicate those of the last half of 1954, they said, even though feeder cattle prices

are two to three cents higher and feed costs are up a little this fall.

According to the farm economists, the peak in the present cattle cycle probably has been reached.

Francis Kutish, Iowa State College, said cattle numbers are likely to remain steady or decline slightly in the next year or so and then turn upward again. You can call it the start of a new cycle or a hesitation in the present one," he said.

Turning to the hog market, the farm management experts advised selling spring pigs "when they reach market weight." The same holds true for fall pigs, they said.

The outlook for turkey prices for the rest of the year is a little lower than last year. "Lower prices of broilers and roasters will depress turkey prices somewhat," said Leonard Schruben, Kansas State College.

Poultry profits won't be as good this winter as last. Kutish said we have too many eggs for the demand, and a few too many depresses prices sharply.

In answer to whether they expected much change in farm costs next year, the economic experts said over-all farm costs will decline very little.

Taxes, fuel, seed, fertilizer and labor will remain about the same, Kutish pointed out. When you shop for trucks, machinery and automobiles, Schruben said, you should find better trade-ins being offered next year.
