1955 License Plates Will Be Available January 3rd
In registering motor vehicles for 1955 the following procedure is necessary:
1955 motor vehicle tax on vehicle being registered must be paid. All copies of the tax notice are required when making payment of the tax, and if a notice is not received, one should be obtained from the County Assessor.
1954 registration certificate must be presented in applying for renewal of license.
1955 registration fee is the same as that for 1954. \$8.00 for passenger cars weighing 3000 lbs. or more, and \$6.00 if the car weighs less than 3000 lbs.
Add 25c postage if the plates are to be mailed.
1954 Nebraska licenses will be delinquent after February 15th.
