### "E" AND "H" BONDS

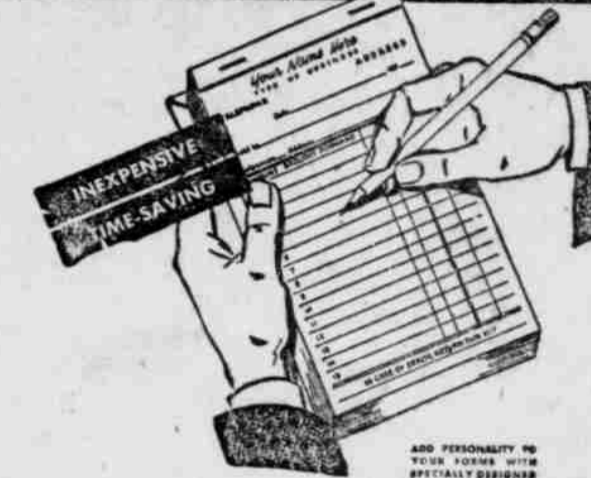
