Gas Tax Bill Most Debated In Unicameral

The Legislature this week has about finished the business of introducing bills. As of this Friday, we have had 329 bills introduced compared to 374 bills a year ago at this time. There are estimates of about 550 bills being put in at this session.

The bill upon which there has been much debate is L. B. 15 which would allow the State Treasurer to start paying the counties their share of the gas tax. This bill would use as one factor in the division, the 1950 census figures. 22 counties will gain and 22 counties will lose in this class. One county, Cass, will remain about the same and the rest of the counties will lose in varying degrees. These counties wanted the 1940 census figures used, and the opposite would have happened.

L. B. 15 is a temporary measure which will be in effect only until a new formula for distribution is worked out. I have been working on such a formula but cannot tell in yet whether my result will be satisfactory to a majority of the legislature. It is conceded that some change will be made during this session.

L. B. 8 is being held by the Government Committee and I will attempt to have some action on it next week. It provides for a licensing system for trailer courts. A person wishing to operate such a court will have to petition the County Commissioners for a license. The Commissioners will publish notice and hold a hearing. Any one wishing to object may come to the hearing and state his objections. In some instances a trailer court might be placed in a school district unable to handle the increased load of pupils and, I believe the taxpayers should have the right to object if they desire before a trailer court is built.

It is impossible under our constitution to use a license system to tax. Therefore the revenue from such a law would bring in very little money.

There is a lot of opposition to this bill and I anticipate trouble in getting it passed, however, I believe it to be sound and I will work for its passage.

COLORADO HERMIT DIES

AGUILAR, COL. — Arthur Minter Pritchard, 77-year-old bachelor hermit, who barricaded his home to visitors after the death of his parents in the early 1930's, was found dead apparently of natural causes. Vast amounts of canned food, soap, furniture, boxes, books and other articles were found in the house, plus more than \$1,500 in cash hidden in boxes and tobacco sacks.
