SYRACUSE - Royal Tradition 20th, a bull consigned by Clyde Althouse of Eagle, was named the champion bull of the annual Nemaha Valley Hereford Association show and sale. The animal sold at the top sale price of \$510 to Ralph Harland of Hickman.

The animal was described as a medium-colored senior bull calf with great width, depth and thickness, standing on straight heavy-boned legs and displaying a breezy, burly-looking head. Reserve champion bull was R. Larry 23rd, consigned by Iva Rodaway of Omaha and sold to Scott Bros, Pawnee City, for \$495.

Kneer With Fleet During Evacuation

HONG KONG (PHTNC) - Navy Lt. (jg) Warren G. Kneer, son of Mr. and Mrs. Erwin A. Kneer, 910 Ave. D, Plattsmouth, Nebr., is aboard the heavy cruiser USS Pittsburgh, which recently visited here after participating in the successful evacuation of the Tachen Islands.

The Pittsburgh, a unit of the U. S. Seventh Fleet, was at Fukuoka, Japan, for liberty when the order came for her to join other units for the evacuation.

Famed Three-Cent Stamp May Be Facing Oblivion in Plan

WASHINGTON - The 3-cent stamp may soon step out of its role as intimate little necessity in the American's everyday life. The Post Office Department wants to substitute a 4-cent stamp for use on first class mail. If that happens, 3-centers will be plucked for the last time from the dark recesses of dainty handbags and ferreted from the worn folds of wallets and the dusty corners of office desks and home bureaus all over the letter-writing United States.

No other denomination has a history as diversified as the 3-cent stamp, says the National Geographic Society.

First Appeared in 1851
The first 3-center appeared in 1851 four years after the government started issuing adhesive postage stamps. Brick red, it carried a profile of Washington designed from a bust by Houdon.

From then until now, 3-cent stamps have provided more revenue than any other denomination. In the fiscal year 1954 alone, 10,174,398,000 were run off, bringing in some \$300,000,000. Three regular issues (1923's Jefferson, 1952's NATO and 1954's Statue of Liberty) accounted for nearly 9,000,000,000. The 1938 stamp - printed 16 years - was probably the most used stamp on record. The Liberty stamp came out in June, 1954, the first 3-cent issue inscribed with "In God We Trust."

The 3-cent stamps have composed a gallery of leading Americans and a chronicle of epic events.

At least 14 have honored Washington, from nearly profiles through commemorative markings his birthday, bicentennial, the end of the Revolution, his first inauguration and the battle of Brooklyn. Washington's effigy appeared on a Mount Rushmore stamp and on the Washington and Lee University 200th anniversary commemorative in 1949.

Monroe, Jackson, Lincoln and both Roosevelts have adorned the 3-cent stamp - also William Penn, Webster and Generals Lafayette, Sherman, Grant, Sheridan, Goethals and Stephen W. Kearny.

Still others were: Edgar Allen Poe, Luther Burbank, Victor Herbert, Augustus Saint-Gaudens, Al Smith, Edison, Joseph Pulitzer, George Washington Carver, Clara Barton, Juliette Low (Girl Scout leader), Will Rogers, Moira Michael (founder of the memorial poppy), Joel Chandler Harris, Samuel Gompers, Betsy Ross, George Eastman, Harlan F. Stone and "Casey" Jones of railroad fame.

FRIGATE HAS LARGEST WINGS FOR HIS BODY
Among birds, the frigate, or man-of-war, carries the longest wings for the size of the body. The narrow wings of an adult span seven feet, permitting effortless gliding, says the National Geographic Society. Unlike many sea birds, the frigate lacks waterproof plumage. To avoid water, adults dive-bomb flying fish or snatch prey from the crest of a wave. Often they rob a booby on the wing, forcing it to drop its fish dinner and sealing the loot before it hits the water.
