LINCOLN — Plattsmouth finished 28th with 2 1-3 points in the state class B track and field meet held here Friday and Saturday at Lincoln.

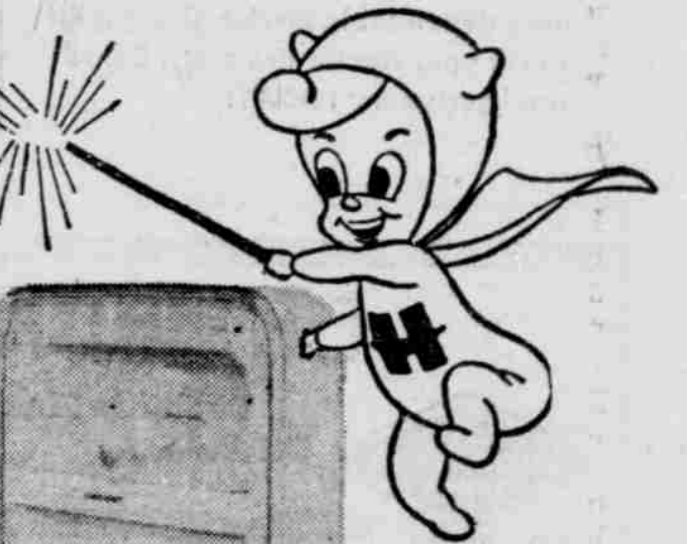
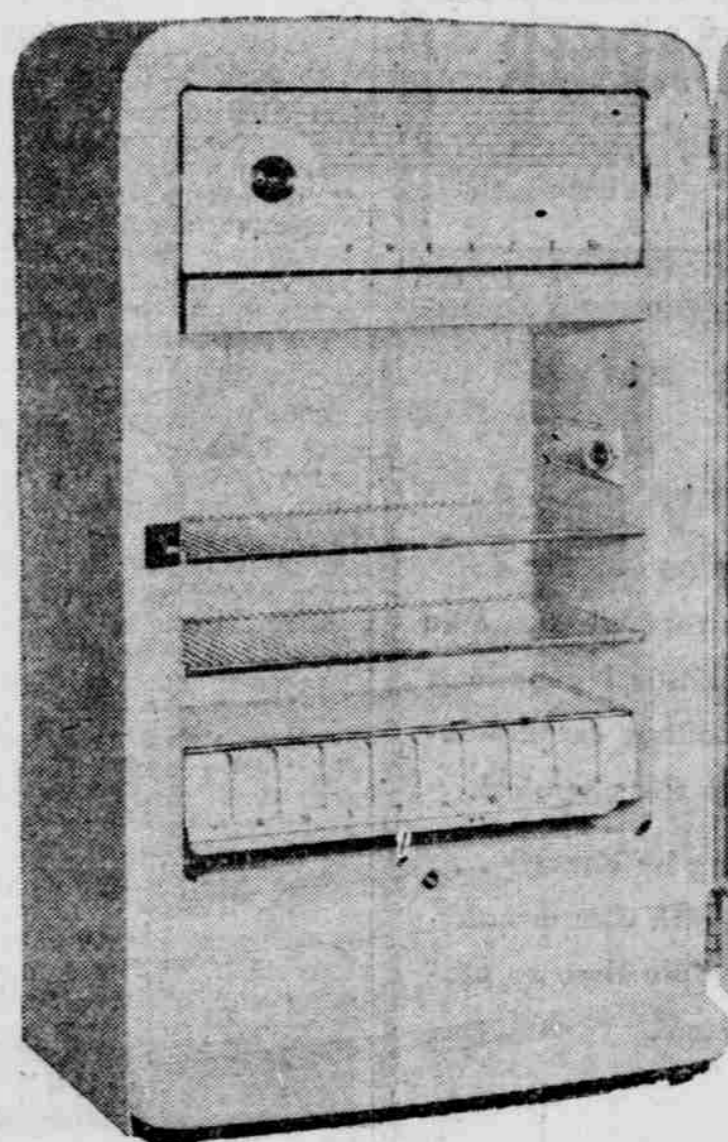
