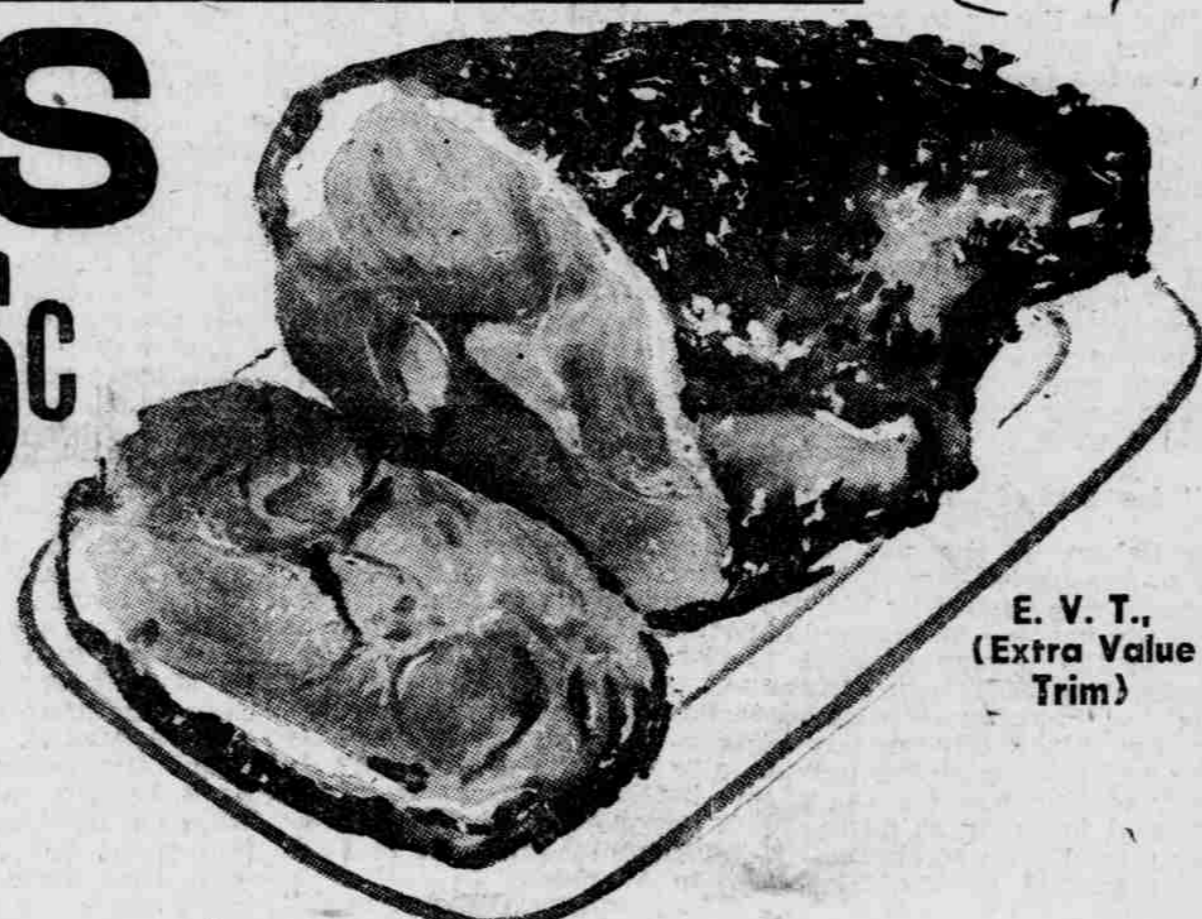

Nebraska Childrens Society adds Case Worker for Area

In a move to expand its services to children in this area, Nebraska Children's Home Society has added to its fine case work staff Miss Esther Olewine of Lincoln who has been supervisor of children's cases in the Lancaster County Assistance Office.

Varro Tyler of Nebraska City, a trustee of the Society, in announcing Miss Olewine's appointment said: "It has been the desire of the Society for some time to provide more intensive casework with adolescent boys and girls, work more closely with unwed mothers in meeting their problems and to provide consultation services to county officials and others."

"Nebraska Children's Home Society was established 63 years ago for the care and placement of normal children, and although the emphasis during recent years has been on adoption, a tremendous amount of emergency boarding care and counseling is a part of the state-wide program."
