ORDINANCE NO. 914  
AN ORDINANCE CREATING  
STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 114 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA: DEFINING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF A CERTAIN STREET BY PAVING AND SUCH OTHER WORK AS MAY BE INCIDENTAL THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska; Section 1. That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth in the County of Cass, State of Nebraska, do hereby find that a petition signed by more than 60% of the resident owners owning property directly abutting upon the street hereinafter ordered paved has been filed and that it is to the best interest of said city to create Street Improvement District No. 114.

Section 2. That there is hereby created with the City of Plattsmouth a Street Improvement District, to be known and described as Street Improvement District No. 114, the outer boundaries of which are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north property line of Avenue F (also known as Hickory Street) and the east line of Lot Nine (9) in Block Seventy four (74) City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence north along the east line of said Lot Nine (9), Block Seventy four (74), extended, to its intersection with the north property line of Avenue G (also known as Timber Street);

Thence west along the north property line of said Avenue G to its intersection with the west line of Lot Ten (10), Block Two hundred twenty two (222) in the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence south along the west line of said Lot Ten (10), Block Two hundred twenty two (222), extended, to its intersection with the north property line of said Avenue F;

Thence east along the north property line of said Avenue F to the point of beginning.

Section 3. The following street within said Street Improvement District No. 114 shall be and is hereby ordered improved by paving and such other work as may be incidental thereto: TWELFTH STREET, beginning at the north property line of Avenue F and thence running north on said Twelfth Street to the north property line of Avenue G.

All work essential for or necessarily incidental to the construction of said improvement shall be done in connection therewith as part thereof.

Section 4. All of said improvement shall be constructed to the established grades as fixed by ordinances of the City, and shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications to be made by Hemmingson, Dur-

ham & Richardson, Inc., Consulting Engineers, employed by the Council. Said improvement shall be made at public cost but special assessments on specially benefited property shall be levied to reimburse the City to the extent provided by law.

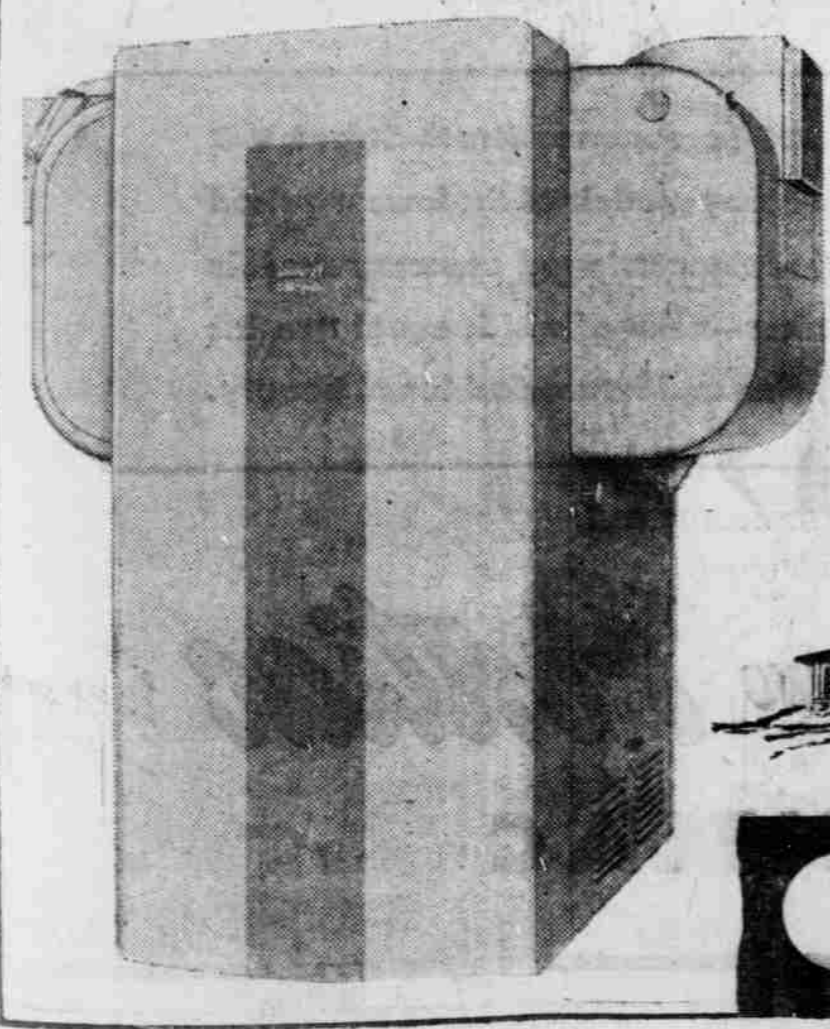
