



FARM PRICES

Farm prices dropped two per cent during the month ended in mid-July, according to the Agri-culture Department. This decline largely reflected lower prices for hogs, potatoes, apples, wheat and watermelons. Prices for a few commodities went up, including milk, tomatoes, grape-fruit, cotton, lettuce and eggs. The Department said the general level of prices received by farmers averaged 84 per cent of parity, compared with 86 per cent in mid-June, 88 per cent a year ago and a record high of 123 per cent in October, 1946.
