Lieut. Hansen Home

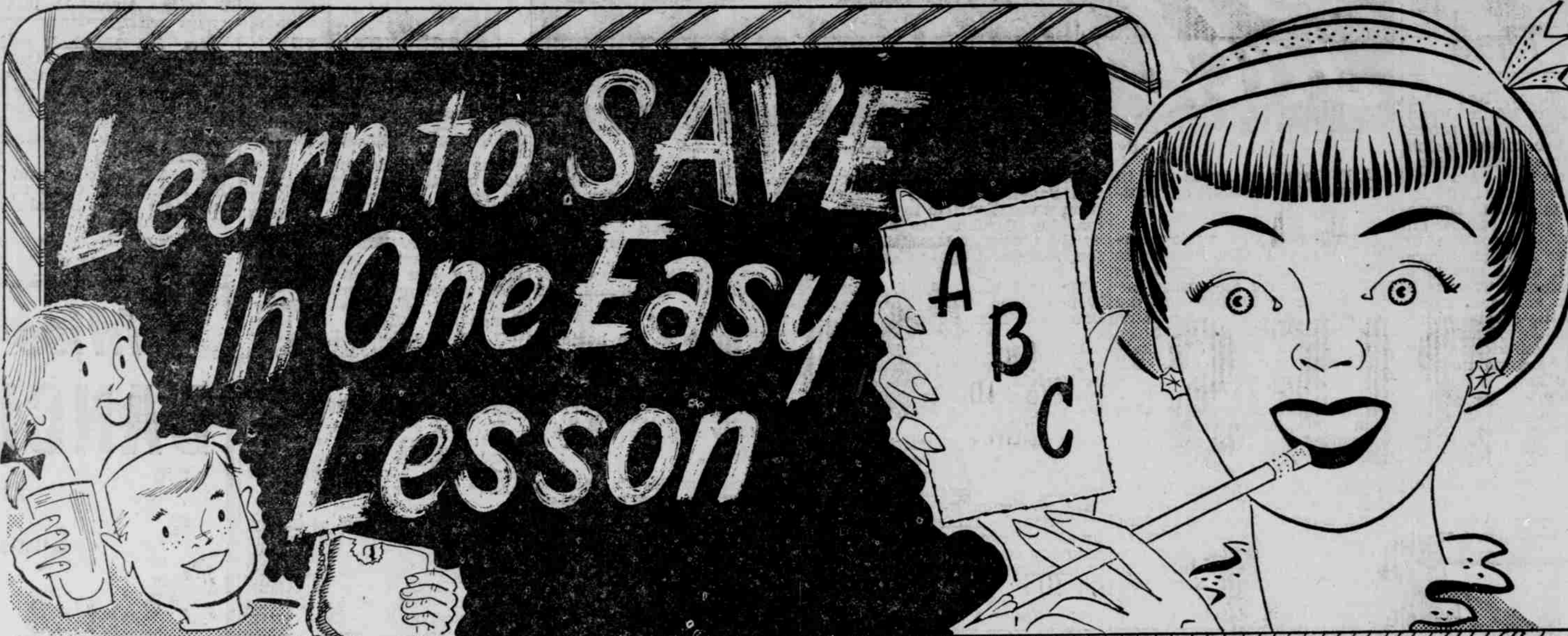
