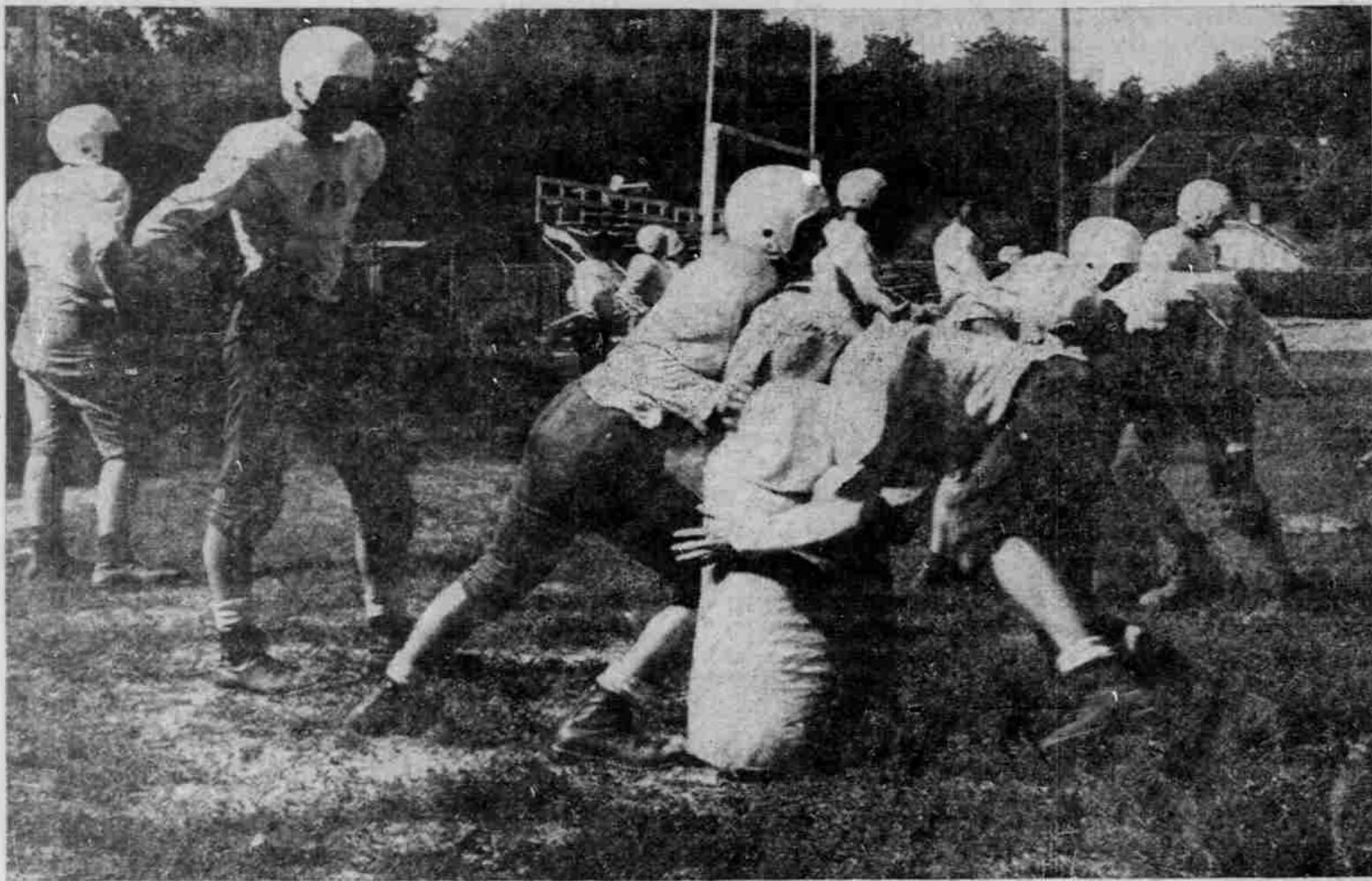


Blue Devils' Muscles Sore

Plattsmouth high school's football practice field was nothing but a mess of sore aching muscles this week as the two-a-day practice session stiffened up most of the 55 squadmen who are trying to get ready for a Sept. 9 home season opener with Crete.

The Blue Devils got their first taste of scrimmage on Tuesday when Coach Burdette Hansen sent his charges through preliminary "for real" football.

"I was a little disappointed," said Hansen. The single wing, being installed by Hansen this year, a switch from the T-type formation, used basically by the Ken Schroeder coached squad last year, appeared to be confusing to the present squad at first.

Eye of Police to Be Fastened On Minors Driving to School

Young drivers racing here and you without thought, will feel a stern parental eye and that of the Plattsmouth police force on them.

This seemed obvious in a statement issued by the Plattsmouth police department.

Police Chief John Hobscheid told the Journal today that he was requesting the cooperation of parents of minor drivers operating vehicles on school and learner permits. He said the Plattsmouth police force had no desire to be arbitrary or oppressive but that he did expect to enforce the state law governing

the right to operate motor vehicles and that anyone violating the law could expect to be held strictly accountable.

Chief Hobscheid called particular attention to the provisions of the law governing the right to operate vehicles by youngsters who had either a school permit or a learner's permit. He requested that these provisions be published for the information of drivers and parents alike.

A school permit can be issued to a minor under 16 years of age and over 14 years of age for the purpose of driving a vehicle to and from the school building where he attends school, if such minor lives at least one and one-half miles from school. The chief stated specifically that the law provided that such permit can be used only in driving to and from

school "by the nearest highway or street from his place of residence" and that "such permit shall be used for the sole purpose of transporting such minors to attend school."

Chief Hobscheid also called attention to the change made by the 1955 Legislature in the statute allowing learners permits to those who are at least 15½ years old. The law previously required the holder of a learner's permit to be accompanied by a "licensed operator." It now provides that the person accompanying the holder of a learner's permit to be not only a "licensed operator" but also to be "at least 21 years of age and to be actually occupying the seat beside the driver."

The chief appeared to be especially concerned about some students habit of driving around the city during the noon-hour and after school hours. He said that he hoped that there would be no necessity for any full scale enforcement drive but added that unless he had the parents' cooperation this might become necessary.

Wells Drilled On a Weekend Solve Problem

Water isn't much of a problem to Bert Pollock on his farm just east of Plattsmouth.

This summer the Morehead Brothers, who farm the land, and Mr. Pollock, pumped water from the Missouri river through sprays to irrigate part of their corn planted there. It was a successful venture. Where the corn was irrigated, Mr. Pollock says he believes he will have a fair stand of corn but where irrigation water was not used, the corn is ruined by dry weather.

There was only one hitch, and that was, that was solved. The Missouri river was too far away from the corn fields. Two wells were put down, requiring about 6 hours in the drilling. They are 70 feet deep and about a foot in diameter, and will yield, rated at 1,400 gallons per minute.

Mr. Pollock said the driller found a fine bed of gravel containing water on the river bottom and entered perforated casings into the wells, packed on the outside with gravel to allow flowage into the well.
