## Labor Supply Moves Up Slightly in Area

NEBRASKA CITY — A slight increase rather than the declines of the past two months characterized the August labor supply, reports the Nebraska State Employment Service office here. August closed with 334 job seekers compared to 307 for July.

Increases were shown mainly in the agricultural and unskilled occupations. Non-agricultural labor demand indicated by employer orders was near the July level of 393 with 389 in August.

Jobs filled through the Employment Service totaled 349 of which 72 were in agriculture. Plattsmouth and Cass County operations included orders for 21 non-agricultural workers, 29 persons directed to job opportunities, 23 non-agricultural and 37 agricultural jobs filled, 17 new applications for work, and 102 visits to the office for employment services.
