Nebraska City for the State Blind School.  
Said Mrs. Schnell: "We feel the board should make a complete study of the situation in Nebraska before deciding on any new construction."  
But Board Chairman Thomas Dredla said the 1955 legislature, by killing bills that would have moved the school, set the site of the institution as Nebraska City.  
"The legislature ruled out any other city, there's no question about that," Dredla said.  
Board members indicated recently they may visit institutions for the blind in other states so they might better decide the type of structure to be built at Nebraska City.
