Greenwood Opens Basketball Season With Win Over Walton

WALTON — Greenwood high school was the first basketball team from Cass county to see action this year and they did it with a win over Walton 40 to 35 here. It was also the first outing of the season for the Walton team.

Greenwood shook off a 9-7 first quarter lead by Walton and went ahead 18 to 13 at halftime and carried the game by nine points by the end of three quarters, 25-34.

Larry Warren led Greenwood scoring with 17 points. Doeden led Walton with 14.
