Mrs. Richard Beverage, 612 Avenue C, Plattsmouth, received an honorable mention in the tablecloth classification of the 1955 Nationwide Crochet Contest, it was announced today in New York City. Her crocheted tablecloth was entered in the contest through the Cass County Fair.

Final judging of the Nationwide Crochet Contest was conducted in New York City by a group of the nation's leading needlework experts. The winning crocheted pieces were selected from over 3,000 entries, on the basis of general appearance, beauty of design, and workmanship. Cash prizes of \$3000 are being awarded to the winning contestants.

The classifications were as follows: Tablecloths, bedspreads, luncheon cloths, centerpieces, buffet and vanity sets, chair sets, doilies, scarves and wall panels, pot holders and hot plate mats, place mats and sets, other household accessories, edgings and insertions, fashion accessories, ladies over 65, men only and teen-age girls.

All crochet entries judged in the finals will be on display in New York City at the Henry Hudson Hotel from Nov. 30 to Dec. 2.
