Every Day Is SD Days Says Col. Sanders

Obedience to traffic laws can make every day S-D Day!

Reminding Nebraskans of S-D Day, Dec. 1, Colonel C. J. Sanders, Nebraska Safety Patrol, urged that all citizens cooperate to make Safe-Driving an every day practice.

Colonel Sanders said, "Motorists and pedestrians should recognize the fact that traffic laws and regulations are made for their protection.

"Too many people are inclined to regard traffic laws and regulations as restrictions on their personal freedom and to ignore them whenever it suits their convenience."

The colonel branded as suicidal the current disregard of traffic laws so prevalent throughout the country. Almost all traffic accidents, he said, occur when one or more traffic laws is violated by motorists, pedestrians or both.

"It has been estimated," Colonel Sanders said, "that if every driver and pedestrian observed traffic laws and regulations and safe walking and driving rules, the annual traffic toll would be reduced between 85 and 90 per cent."

Pointing out that S-D Day should be an every day occurrence, he listed five acts that are high on the list of traffic law violations and urged motorists to practice rigid obedience. The five acts listed by the Colonel include:

Exceeding a safe speed.

Failure to give a car on the right the right of way at intersections.

Failure to give pedestrians already in the cross walk the right of way.

Not coming to a full stop at stop signs.

Improper passing.

"I am convinced," he continued, "that if all our drivers would obey these five traffic

NEWS POSTAL DEVICE

Through the medium of new red, white and blue steel racks to be placed in the lobbies of some 750 big office buildings throughout the country, the Post Office Department will allow the public to sort its own mail. The racks, holding three mail bags ready to be tied up when filled, will have three funnel slots: "Local," "Out-of-town" and "Airmail" designations. The new device is expected to both speed delivery and save more than 5600,000 a year in Post Office sorting cost. x
